- 1. It's berry picking time! To help you get a better feel for getting into God's Word make a list of similarities between studying God's Word and picking berries. (Example: When you pick you need to be prepared with proper equipment: hat, long sleeves and pants along with a bucket. To study you need a quiet place, a Bible, paper, and pencil)
- 2. What should be some key practices in the life of a believer as they interact with God's Word? Read James 1:19-25 and list some steps that James lays out for our approach to and application of God Word.
- 3. Read 2 Tim 3:16 and meditate on what Paul lists as the values of studying God's Word. Note your findings below.
- 4. In Matt 11:28-29 Jesus uses the word "rest" twice in these two verses. The first usage relates to one's salvation (i.e. peace with God). While the second usage refers to a believer's rest in their daily walk with Him. Check the following passages and consider any phrases that could be considered equivalent to what Jesus is referred to as the "believer's rest". See Jer 6:16; Luke 9:23; Gal 5:16, 25; Eph 5:18; Col 3:15-16. Can you think of any other passages?
- 5. Hebrews 4:8-10 seem to be pointing to another type of rest; how would you describe it?
